

Shimada Tadashi: Wild Moments The World of Beautiful Birds

The Tokyo Photographic Art Museum will be holding a solo exhibition by one of today's leading nature photographers, SHIMADA Tadashi, whose work is highly regarded throughout the world.

Shimada Tadashi (1949–) is world-famous for his photographs of wildlife, particularly those of kingfishers. From works that capture the powerful sense of presence and sublime vitality of kingfishers and ruddy kingfishers, to delicate photographs of other birds that live in Japan's humid climate, his diverse works share the same consciousness and sensibilities that are a feature of the traditional Nihonga-style of painting that promotes 'learning from nature', and are highly regarded everywhere. This exhibition will feature an overview of his forty-year career while also introducing his pictures of the rare wildlife in 'the world's oldest rainforest' of New Guinea, which enthrall people with their mysterious and beautiful appearance.

As the 2020 Tokyo Summer Olympic/Paralympic approaches, the development of photographic technology knows no bounds and we look forward to seeing ever more fascinating and varied forms of expression. We hope that you will come and witness these 'miraculous moments' that are a result of the fusion of Shimada Tadashi's outstanding aesthetics with the latest technology and which transcend human perception.

Artist's background



Shimada Tadashi

Born in Ōimura, Irumagun (present day Fujimino City), Saitama Prefecture in 1949. He grew up enjoying the local countryside and spent his time studying wild birds. After graduating in Animal Husbandry from the Agricultural Veterinary Department of Nihon University in 1971 he participated in the publication of the inaugural issue of the animal magazine, 'Anima' (Heibonsha) and ever since he has worked as a freelance photographer, specializing in wild birds, while developing his own unique style. In 1980 he won the 17th Sun Prize and Photographic Society of Japan's Newcomer's Award for his *Kawasemi seiryū ni tobu* (Kingfisher, Flying Over Clear Streams). In 1986 he won the Photographic Society of Japan's Annual Award for his *Hinotori akashōbin* (Firebird—Ruddy Kingfisher). In 1980 he moved to Chitose City in Hokkaido, thereafter using Hokkaido as the base for his activities both in Japan and abroad. From 1990s onwards he has also produced video works—his *Ezo momonga* (Siberian Flying Squirrel) winning the IBA International Broadcasting Advertisement Award, and his *Kaze no ōkoku-seimei no mori* (Kingdom of the Wind—Forest of Life) winning the Galaxy Encouragement Award (Japan Association of Broadcast Critics).
